Who Are We?

The Person-centred Thinking Task Team was created in April 2012 with representation from the Ministry of Social Services, Community Based Organizations, Saskatchewan Approved Private Homes Inc., Saskatchewan Association for Community Living and SARC.

Our objectives include:

- Provide leadership to stakeholders regarding the development and support of person-centred cultures
- Conduct research to determine best practice related to the three drivers of personcentred cultures; training, philosophy and leadership
- Develop, describe and support methods and processes that enhance systems and supports in the delivery of person-centred services
- Define a comprehensive service delivery framework that creates a culture of person-centredness

- Strengthen and support implementation of the policies related to personcentred planning in the Comprehensive Personal Planning and Support Policy (CPP&SP)
- Develop/establish/identify materials, tools and resources that support person-centred cultures
- Share information related to person-centred culture best practice by establishing communication and networking opportunities in Saskatchewan
